A Grand Day Out at the Village



How did Mildenhall get to be called Minal?

(From the pages of the www.visitoruk.com:) "In the 1970s the parish was distinguished by having the oldest Anglican vicar in the country. When he retired in 1978 the Rev Courtman was aged 94. One of his acts during his rectorship was to introduce the spelling of the village name in the form used orally by local people. This is 'Minal' and if you are in the vicinity, make sure that you pronounce it that way or you will immediately be labelled a 'vurriner'. "
